

**EAST LoTHIAN COUNCIL**  
**(SHORTHOPE STREET)(ONE-WAY) ORDER 2025**

**TO 268/25**

EAST LoTHIAN COUNCIL in exercise of the powers conferred on it by Sections 1(1), 2(1) and (2), 3 and Part III of Schedule 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (“the 1984 Act”) and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with the Traffic Commissioner and Chief Constable in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the 1984 Act hereby make the following Order.

**Citation**

1. This Order may be cited as the “East Lothian Council (Shorthope Street) (One-Way) Order 2025” and shall come into operation on the XX day of Two Thousand and Twenty XX.
2. The restriction imposed by this Order shall be in addition to and not in derogation of any restriction or requirement imposed by any regulations made under the 1984 Act or by any other enactment.

**Interpretation**

3. In this Order, the following expressions have the meanings hereby assigned to them:
  - a. “Chief Constable” means Chief Constable of Police Scotland
  - b. “Motorised vehicle” unless the context otherwise requires, means a vehicle of any description and includes machine or implement of any kind drawn or propelled along roads by mechanical power.

**Articles**

4. No person shall drive or cause or permit to be driven any motorised vehicle in any of the lengths of road except in direction specified in Schedule 1 of this Order.

## **SCHEDULE 1 – One Way Street**

### **1. Shorthope Street**

- a. Northbound direction: From the extended north kerbline of A199 High Street to the extended south kerbline of Millhill.

## **STATEMENT OF REASONS**

Shorthope Street is a key link for people walking and cycling between the River Esk and High Street. The existing narrow footways are sub-standard, contraflow cycling (southbound) is not currently permitted between Millhill and High Street and no crossing facilities are provided at its junction with High Street.

Improvements for active travel are proposed including widening of Shorthope Street's western footway, provision of a raised table at its junction with High Street and permitted contraflow (southbound) cycling.

The proposed Order will support the improvements for walking and cycling, specifically permitting contraflow (southbound) cycling.

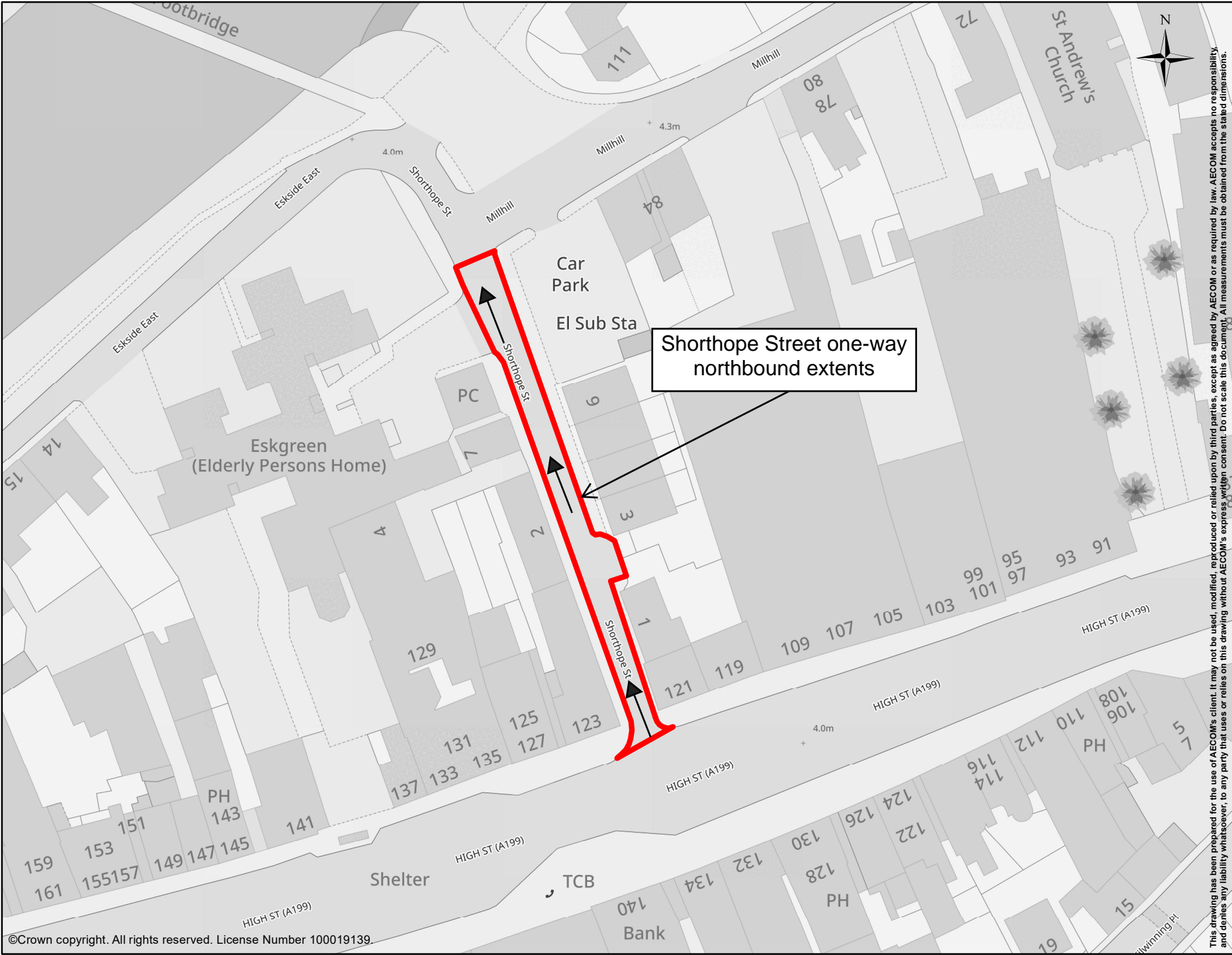
