The Bleachingfield Centre opened its doors in 2012 - a community hub offering a variety of services, including a library, meeting rooms, sports hall and a small children's park. The library offers community programmes/events/exhibitions, book lending, PC use, free Wi-Fi, school class visits, customer enquiries, support for travel pass and Blue Badge applications, digital and local history resources and is a warm space within the local community. The Library is an enquiry point for all face-to-face East Lothian Council customer service enquiries and accepts payments for Council services. It is held on the Dunbar Common Good account.
