DUNBAR TOWN HOUSE

A Renaissance-style building from circa 1620, now serves as a museum and gallery open to the public. The top floor has former council chambers room which can be hired, and community meeting space is also available on the first floor. Visitors are a mix of holiday makers, tourists, group visitors including schools and local history researchers. Opening hours for the ELC operated museum and gallery reduced by 28.5% in April 2024. It is Category A listed by Historic Environment Scotland and held on the Dunbar Common Good account.
