HADDINGTON TOWN HOUSE

Built in 1745 and built in the Scottish Baronial style it historically served as a community facility and meeting place for the Council. The Town House was mothballed during the Covid-19 pandemic, the Council Chambers on the ground floor is the only part of the building currently in use. It is Category A listed by Historic Environment Scotland and held on the Haddington Common Good account.
