THE JOHN GRAY CENTRE

The John Gray Centre is a heritage hub, housing the Haddington Library (ground floor), a local history museum (1st floor) and the East Lothian Archive (2nd floor). The centre hosts regular activities/events and exhibits. The library offers community programmes/events/exhibitions, book lending, PC use, free Wi-Fi, school class visits, customer enquiries, support for travel pass and Blue Badge applications, digital resources and is a warm space within the local community. Museum opening hours were reduced by 40% from April 2024. It is Category B/C listed by Historic Environment Scotland.
